## Before You Start

### Safety Instructions

#### WARNING

- For your safety, do not remove the battery incorporated in the product. If you need to replace the battery, take it to the nearest authorized LG Electronics service point or dealer for assistance.
- Li-Ion Battery is a hazardous component which can cause injury.
- Battery replacement by non-qualified professional can cause damage to your device.

#### WARNING

- To reduce the possibility of electric shock, do not expose your device to high humidity areas, such as the bathroom, swimming pool, etc.

**Always store your device away from heat.** Never store your device in settings that may expose it to temperatures less than 32 °F (0 °C) or greater than 104 °F (40 °C), such as outside during extreme weather conditions or in your car on a hot day. Exposure to excessive cold or heat will result in malfunction, damage and/or catastrophic failure.

**Be careful when using your device near other electronic devices.** RF emissions from your device may affect nearby inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

You should consult with manufacturers of any personal medical devices such as pacemakers and hearing aids to determine if they are susceptible to interference from your device.

Turn off your device in a medical facility or at a gas station. Never place your device in a microwave oven as this will cause the battery to explode.

## Safety Information

## Cautions for Battery

- Do not disassemble.

- Do not expose to high temperature: 140 °F (60 °C).
- Do not incinerate.

## Battery Disposal

## Exposure to Radio Frequency Signal

Your wireless handheld portable device is a low power radio transmitter and receiver.

When it is ON, it receives and also sends out radio frequency (RF) signals. In August, 1996, the Federal Communications Commissions (FCC) adopted RF exposure guidelines with safety levels for handheld wireless devices.

Those guidelines are consistent with the safety standards previously set by both U.S. and international standards bodies:

- ANSI C95.1 (1992) \*

- NCRP Report 86 (1986)

- ICNIRP (1996)

Those standards were based on comprehensive and periodic evaluations of the relevant scientific literature. For example, over 120 scientists, engineers, and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industry experts reviewed the available body of research to develop the ANSI Standard (C95.1).

\* American National Standards Institute; National Council on Radiation Protection and Measurements; International Commission on Non-ionizing Radiation Protection The design of your device complies with the FCC guidelines (and those standards).

## Tips on Efficient Operation

For your device to operate most efficiently:

Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily when the device is in use.

Contact with the antenna affects call quality and may cause the device to operate at a higher power level than otherwise needed.

## Driving

Check the laws and regulations on the use of wireless devices in the areas where you drive. Always obey them. Also, if using your device while driving, please:

- Give full attention to driving - driving safely is your first responsibility;
- Use hands-free operation, if available;
- Pull off the road and park before using it.

## Electronic Devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from RF signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless device.

## Pacemakers

The Health Industry Manufacturers Association recommends that a minimum separation of six (6") inches be maintained between a handheld wireless device and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research by and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research.

Persons with pacemakers:

- Should ALWAYS keep the device more than six inches from their pacemaker when the device is turned ON.
- Should not carry the device in a breast pocket.
- Should use the ear opposite the pacemaker to minimize the potential for interference.
- If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, turn your device OFF immediately.

## Hearing Aids

Some digital wireless devices may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may want to consult your service provider.

## Other Medical Devices

If you use any other personal medical device, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF energy. Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

## Health Care Facilities

Turn your device OFF in health care facilities when any regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so. Hospitals or health care facilities may use equipment that could be sensitive to external RF energy.

## Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle.

You should also inform the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

## Posted Facilities

Turn your device OFF in any facility where posted notices so require.

## Aircraft

## Potentially Explosive Atmosphere

Turn your device OFF when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often, but not always, marked clearly.

Potential areas may include: fueling areas (such as gasoline stations); below deck on boats; fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities; vehicles using liquefied petroleum gas (such as propane or butane); areas where the air contains chemicals or particles (such as grain, dust, or metal powders); and any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle engine.

## For Vehicles Equipped with an Air Bag

An air bag inflates with great force. DO NOT place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. If in-vehicle wireless equipment is improperly installed and the air bag inflates, serious injury could result.

## Charger and Adapter Safety

The charger and adapter are intended for indoor use only.

## Battery Information and Care

- Please dispose of your battery properly or take it to your local wireless carrier for recycling.
- The battery does not need to be fully discharged before recharging.
- Use only LG-approved chargers specific to your device model since they are designed to maximize battery life.

- Do not disassemble or impact the battery as it may cause electric shock, shortcircuit, and fire. Store the battery in a place out of reach of children.
- Replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. If you need to replace the battery, take it to the nearest authorized LG Electronics service centre or dealer for assistance.
- Recharge the battery after long periods of non-use to maximize battery life.
- Battery life will vary due to usage patterns and environmental conditions.
- Use of extended backlighting, Media Net Browsing, and data connectivity kits affect battery life and standby times.
- Actual battery life will depend on network configuration, product settings, usage patterns, battery and environmental conditions.
- Always unplug the charger from the wall socket after the device is fully charged to save unnecessary power consumption of the charger.

## Explosion, Shock, and Fire Hazards

- Do not put your device in a place subject to excessive dust and keep the minimum required distance between the power cord and heat sources.
- Unplug the power cord prior to cleaning your device, and clean the power plug pin when it is dirty.
- When using the power plug, ensure that it is firmly connected. If it is not, it may cause excessive heat or fire.
- If you put your device in a pocket or bag without covering the receptacle of the device (power plug pin), metallic articles (such as a coin, paperclip or pen) may short-circuit the device. Always cover the receptacle when not in use.
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Metallic articles such as a coin, paperclip or pen in your pocket or bag may short-circuit the + and – terminals of the battery (metal strips on the battery) upon moving. Short-circuiting of the terminal may damage the battery and cause an explosion.



## General Notice

- Using a damaged battery or placing a battery in your mouth may cause serious injury.
- Do not place items containing magnetic components such as a credit card, device card, bank book or subway ticket near your device. The magnetism of the device may damage the data stored in the magnetic strip.
- When the device is not being used for a long period time, store it in a safe place with the power cord unplugged.
- Using the device in proximity to receiving equipment (i.e., TV or radio) may cause interference to the device.

- Your device is an electronic device that generates heat during normal operation. Extremely prolonged, direct contact with skin in the absence of adequate ventilation may result in discomfort or minor burns. Therefore, use care when handling your device during or immediately after operation.
- Do not attempt to repair or modify the device yourself. Your device is equipped with an internal rechargeable battery which should be replaced only by LG or an authorized LG repair centre. You should never attempt to open or disassemble this device yourself and doing so may cause damage that will void your warranty.

## Consumer Information on SAR (Specific Absorption Rate)

### **This Model Device Meets the Government's Requirements for Exposure to Radio Waves.**

Your wireless device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radiofrequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The exposure standard for wireless mobile device employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg. \* Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions specified by the FCC with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands.

Although SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. Because the device is designed to operate at multiple power levels to use only the power required to reach the network, in general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

Before a device model is available for sale to the public, it must be tested and certified by the FCC that it does not exceed the limit established by the government adopted requirement for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) as required by the FCC for each model.

The highest SAR value for this device when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is 0.89 W/kg. (Body-worn measurements

differ among devices models, depending upon available accessories and FCC/IC requirements.) While there may be differences between SAR levels of various devices and at various positions, they all meet the government requirement for safe exposure.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model device with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF emission guidelines. # Important Notice



## Please read this before you start using your device!

Please check to see whether any problems you encountered with your device are described in this section before taking the device in for service or calling a service representative.

### 1. Device memory

You may need to check your device memory and delete some data, such as applications to make more memory available.

#### To uninstall applications:

- 1 Tap  >  > **Apps**.
- 2 Once all applications appear, scroll to and select the application you want to uninstall.
- 3 Tap **Uninstall**.

### 2. Optimizing battery life

Extend your battery's power by turning off features that you do not need to run constantly in the background. You can monitor how applications and system resources consume battery power.

#### Extending your device's battery life:

- Turn off radio communications when you are not using. If you are not using Wi-Fi, Bluetooth® or GPS, turn them off.
- Reduce screen brightness and set a shorter screen timeout.
- Turn off automatic syncing for Gmail, Calendar, Contacts and other applications.
- Some applications you download may consume battery power.
- While using downloaded applications, check the battery charge level.

### 3. Before installing an open source application and OS

#### WARNING

- If you install and use an OS other than the one provided by the manufacturer it may cause your device to malfunction. In addition, your device will no longer be covered by the warranty.
- To protect your device and personal data, only download applications from trusted sources, such as Play Store™. If there are improperly installed applications on your device, the device may not work normally or a serious error may occur. You must uninstall those applications and all associated data and settings from the device.

### 4. Using the Hard Reset (Factory Reset)

If your device does not restore to its original condition, use a Hard Reset (Factory Reset) to initialize it.

- 1 Turn the power off.
- 2 Press and hold the **Power/Lock Key + Volume Down Key** on the right side of the device until the LG logo is displayed.
- 3 Briefly release only the **Power/Lock Key** when the LG logo is displayed.
- 4 Immediately press and hold the **Power/Lock Key** again.
- 5 Release all keys when the Factory reset screen is displayed.
- 6 Press the **Volume Keys** to select Yes, and then press the **Power/Lock Key** to perform a Hard Reset. Perform this step twice.

#### WARNING



- If you perform a Hard Reset, all user applications, user data and DRM licenses will be deleted. Please remember to backup any important data before performing a Hard Reset.



## 5. Opening and switching applications

Multitasking is easy with Android; you can keep more than one application running at the same time. There is no need to quit an application before opening another. Use and switch between several open applications.

Android manages each application, stopping and starting them as needed to make sure that idle applications don't consume resources unnecessarily.

- 1 Tap . App previews of recently used applications will be displayed.
- 2 Tap the application you want to access. This does not stop the previous app from running in the background. Make sure to tap  to back out of an app after using it.
  - To close an app from the recent apps list, swipe the app preview to the left or right. To clear all apps, tap **Clear all**.

## 6. If the screen freezes

If the screen freezes or the device does not respond when you try to operate it:

Press and hold the **Power/Lock Key** for about 10 seconds to reset your device. To turn your device off, press and hold the **Power/Lock Key** for about 20 seconds. If it still does not work, please contact the service centre.



# Special Features

## Comfort view

This feature reduces the amount of blue light on the screen to reduce eye strain.



### Turning the Reader mode on/off

- Slide the Status bar downward, tap , then tap  / .

**OR**

- Tap  >  > **Display** > **Comfort view**, and then tap  / .

### Adjust the blue light filter

- 1 Tap  >  > **Display** > **Comfort view**.
- 2 Select the desired blue light filter setting.

## Gesture shot

The Gesture shot feature allows you to take a picture with a hand gesture using the front camera.

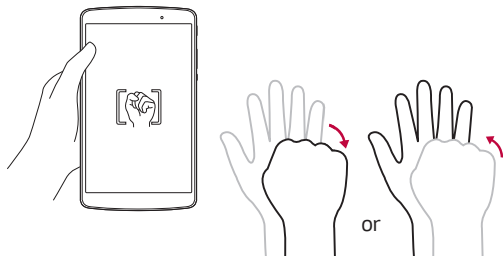
### To take a photo

There are two methods for using the Gesture shot feature.

- Raise your hand, with an open palm, until the front camera detects it and a box appears on the screen. Then close your hand into a fist to start the timer, allowing you time to get ready.

#### OR

- Raise your hand, in a clenched fist, until the front camera detects it and a box appears on the screen. Then unclench your fist to start the timer, allowing you time to get ready.



# KnockON

The KnockON feature allows you to double-tap the screen to easily turn it on or off.

## Turning the screen on

While the screen is off, quickly double-tap the centre of the screen to turn on the backlight and display the Lock screen.

## Turning the screen off

Quickly double-tap the Status bar, an empty area on the Home screen, or the Lock screen to turn the screen off.

### NOTE

- Tap on the centre area of the screen. If you tap on the bottom or the top area, the recognition rate may decrease.



# Knock Code

The Knock Code feature allows you to create your own unlock code using a combination of knocks on the screen. You can access the Home screen directly when the screen is off by tapping the same sequence on the screen.

## NOTE

- Use your fingertip instead of your fingernail to tap the screen when turning it on or off.

## Setting up the Knock Code feature

- 1 Tap  >  > **Display** > **Lock screen** > **Select screen lock** > **Knock Code**.
- 2 Tap the squares in a pattern to set your Knock Code. Your Knock Code pattern can be 6 to 10 taps.


## Unlocking the screen using the Knock Code


When the screen is off, you can unlock it by tapping the Knock Code pattern you've previously set.

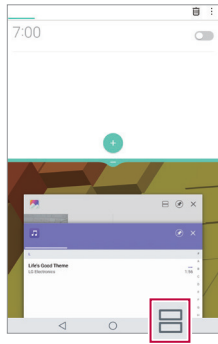
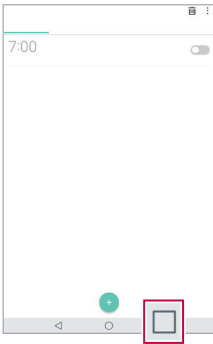
# Multi-tasking feature

## Multi-Window

You can use two apps at the same time by separating the screen into multiple windows.

While using an app, touch and hold  from the Home touch buttons, then select an app from the recently-used apps list.

- You can use two apps at the same time.
- To stop the Multi-Window feature, touch and hold .





### NOTE

- The Multi-Window feature is not supported by some apps, including downloaded apps.

## Overview screen

The Overview screen provides a preview of your recently-used apps.

To view the list of recently-used apps, tap  on the Home touch buttons.


- Touch and hold an app and drag it to the top of the screen to start the app with the Multi-Window feature. You can also tap  at the top of each app preview.









# Capture+

The Capture+ feature allows you to create memos.

## Using Capture+


You can use Capture+ function to easily and efficiently create memos with a saved picture or on the current device screen.

- 1 Touch and slide the Status bar downward and tap 
- 2 Create a memo using the following options:

	Tap to save the memo you've created.
	Tap to undo the most recent action.
	Tap to redo the most recently deleted action.
	Tap to insert text into your memo.
	Tap to select the pen type and colour.
	Tap to crop the image of memo.
	Tap to share the memo or change the background paper style.
	Tap to hide or display the toolbar.

### NOTE

- Please use a fingertip while using the Capture+ feature. Do not use your fingernail.

- 3 Tap  to save the current memo to the **QuickMemo+** or the **Gallery**.

## Viewing the saved memo

Tap  >  and select the **Capture+** album.

**OR**


Tap  >  and select the desired memo.











# QSlide

You can display several apps simultaneously on the same screen and freely switch between them.

## Using QSlide

- 1 When an app is running, tap  > **QSlide**.
- 2 The app switches to the QSlide mode. The following options are available.

		Switch to full-screen mode.
		Adjust the opacity of the QSlide window. You can use the screen under the QSlide window when the opacity bar is not full.
		Close the QSlide window.
		Adjust the size of the QSlide window.






### **NOTE**

- QSlide can support up to two windows at the same time.
- This feature may not be supported by some apps.

# QuickRemote

You can control many electronic devices in different locations by using your device as a remote control.

## Registering a device as a remote control

- 1 Tap  >  > .
- 2 Tap  to specify locations where you want to use the remote control.
- 3 Tap  and select the type and manufacturer of the device you want to remotely control.
- 4 Follow the on-screen instructions to make sure that the QuickRemote feature works properly on the device.

### NOTE

- The QuickRemote operates the same way as an ordinary remote control infrared (IR) signals. Be careful not to cover the infrared sensor at the top of the device when you use the QuickRemote function. This function may not be supported depending on the model, the manufacturer or service company.

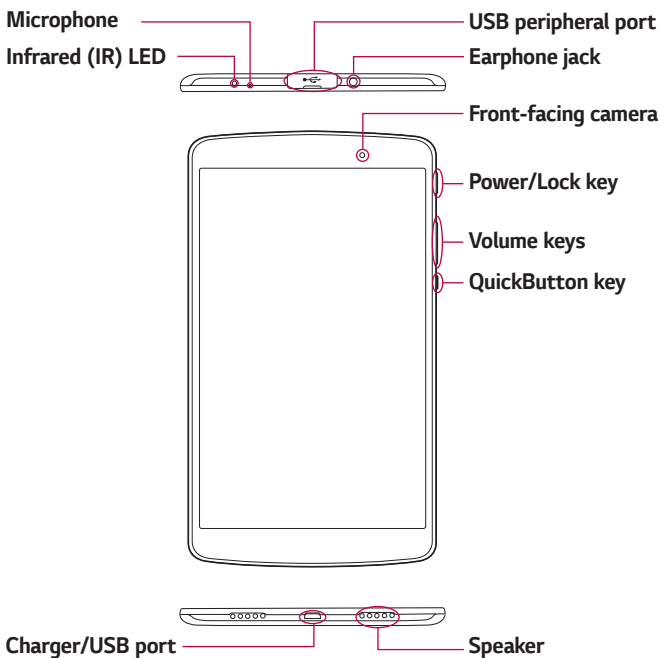

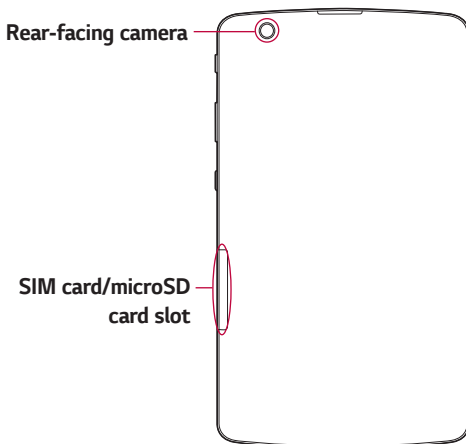

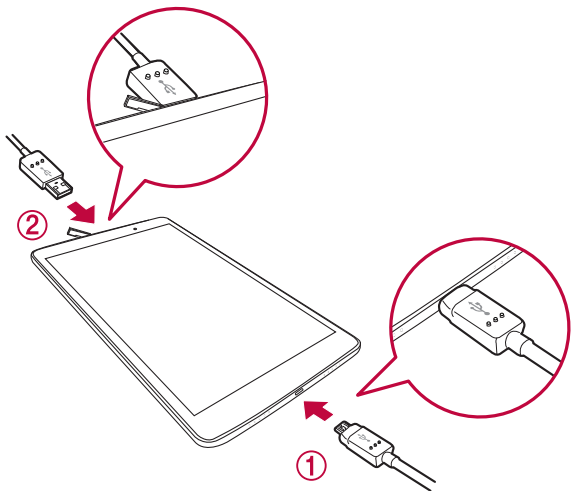

<b>Infrared (IR) LED</b>	Used as a sensor for the QuickRemote app.
<b>Microphone</b>	Records your voice and allows use for voice-activated functions.
<b>USB peripheral port</b>	Allow you to connect a USB peripheral, such as a keyboard, mouse, and external storage to your tablet. Also allows you to charge another device.
<b>Earphone jack</b>	Allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations. You can also plug in headphones to listen to music.
<b>Front-facing camera</b>	Use to take pictures and record videos of yourself. You can also use this for video chatting. Keep it clean for optimal performance.

<b>Power/Lock key</b>	Press to lock/unlock the screen. Press and hold to turn the tablet on/off, restart it, and activate/deactivate airplane mode.
<b>Volume keys</b>	<p><b>While the screen is off:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Press the Volume Up Key twice to launch Capture+.</li> <li>· Press the Volume Down Key twice to launch the Camera.</li> </ul> <p><b>On the Home screen:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Control ringer volume.</li> </ul> <p><b>During a call:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Control your earpiece volume.</li> </ul> <p><b>When playing audio/video:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>· Control volume continuously.</li> </ul>
<b>QuickButton key</b>	Press to launch an app. Press and hold to change the app you wish to get quick access to.
<b>Charger/USB port</b>	Allows you to connect the tablet and the USB cable for use with the charger adapter, your PC, or other compatible accessories.
<b>Speaker</b>	Use to listen to the audio from the selected function (e.g., music, videos, sound clips, etc.).
<b>Rear-facing camera</b>	Use to take photos and record videos. Keep it clean for optimal performance.
<b>SIM card/microSD card slot</b>	Allows you to insert your SIM card and a microSD card.

# Connecting cables to the ports



## 1. Charging the battery

The Charger/USB Port is located at the bottom of the device. Insert the charger and plug it into a power outlet.

Charge the battery before using it for first time. Use the charger included with your device to charge the battery. A computer can also be used to charge the battery by connecting the device to it using the USB cable.

### **WARNING**

- Use only LG-approved chargers, batteries and cables. The use of unapproved chargers, batteries or cables may cause a battery charging delay or display a pop-up message regarding slow charging. It can also cause the battery to explode or damage the device, which is not covered by the warranty.



### **NOTE**

- Your device has an internal rechargeable battery. For your safety, do not remove the embedded battery.
- The battery must be fully charged initially to improve battery lifetime.

Your device supports up to a 2TB microSD card. Depending on the memory card manufacturer and type, some memory cards may not be compatible with your device.

## 2. Connecting a USB device to your tablet

The USB peripheral port is located at the top of the device. Insert the USB port and plug it into the desired device.

Some of the USB devices supported through the USB port include a keyboard, mouse, game controller, digital camera, and storage device (including an Android smartphone acting as external storage device). As most USB keyboards, mouse and game controllers are designed for desktop computers and operation systems, some devices may not function.

### **NOTE**

- Only devices that meet the USB specs may connect to the USB peripheral port.
- If you are experiencing errors with device recognition, please use a shorter USB cable or check the USB Hub with external power supply (Self-Powered Hub).
- Only file systems such as FAT32, exFAT, and NTFS are supported for the external USB storage device.
- Transferring data through both USB devices at the same time is not supported. The first device that is connected has priority. The USB device connected second can only be charged.

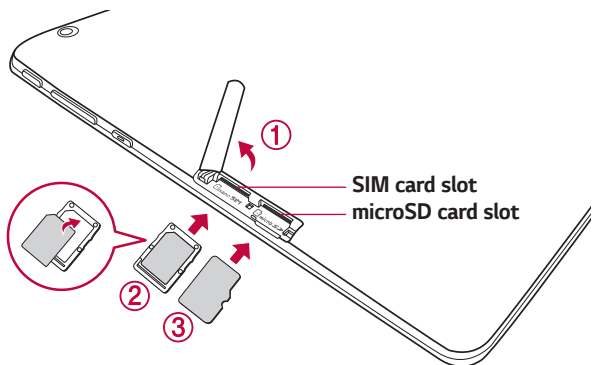
### **WARNING**

- You cannot store data in the USB storage when the battery level is below 15%. Please charge the battery above 15% in order to use the USB storage function.

# Installing the SIM card or microSD card

Before you can start exploring your new device, you need to set it up. Your device supports the use of microSD memory cards of up to 2TB capacity. Multimedia contents can be saved in the microSD card.

- 1 Open the SIM/microSD slot cover.
- 2 Pull out the card tray and put the Nano-SIM card on the card tray, then slide the card tray into the slot as shown in the figure below. Make sure the gold contact area on the card is facing downward.






- 3 If you want to use a memory card, insert the memory card into the slot. Make sure the gold contact area is facing downward. Slide the microSD card into the slot until it “clicks” into place and then close the slot cover.

## NOTE

- Cards must be positioned as shown.
- microSD card is not included.
- Only Nano SIM cards work with this device.
- Depending on the memory card manufacturer and type, some memory cards may not be compatible with your device.

# Removing the memory card

Before removing the memory card, first unmount it for safe removal.

- 1 Tap  >  > **Storage** > .
- 2 Open the card slot cover and press the memory card in to unlock it. Then pull it out of the slot.



## **WARNING**

- Do not remove the memory card while the device is transferring or accessing information. Doing so can cause data to be lost or corrupted or damage to the memory card or device. LG is not responsible for losses that result from the misuse of damaged memory cards, including the loss of data.



# Google Account Setup

The first time you open a Google application on your device, you will be required to sign in with your existing Google account. If you do not have a Google account, you will be prompted to create one.

## Creating your Google account

- 1 Tap  >  > **Accounts & sync**.
- 2 Tap **ADD ACCOUNT** > **Google** > **Or create a new account**.
- 3 Enter your first and last name, then tap **NEXT**.
- 4 Follow the instructions and enter the required and optional information about the account. Wait while the server creates your account.

## Signing into your Google account

- 1 Tap  >  > **Accounts & sync**.
- 2 Tap **ADD ACCOUNT** > **Google**.
- 3 Enter your email address and tap **NEXT**.
- 4 Enter your password and tap **NEXT**.
- 5 After signing in, you can use Gmail and take advantage of Google services on your device.

- 6 Once you have set up your Google account, your device will automatically synchronize with your Google account on the web (if a data connection is available).

After signing in, your device will sync with your Google services, such as Gmail, Contacts, and Google Calendar. You can also use Maps, download applications from Play Store, back up your settings to Google servers, and take advantage of other Google services on your device.

## Locking and unlocking the device

Pressing the Power/Lock Key turns off the screen and puts the device into lock mode. The device automatically gets locked if it is not used for a specified period. This helps to prevent accidental taps and saves battery power.



To unlock the device, press the **Power/Lock Key** and swipe the screen in any direction.

### NOTE

- Double-tapping on the screen also can wake up the screen instead of the Power/Lock Key.

## Changing the screen lock method

You can change the way that you lock the screen to prevent others accessing your personal information.

- 1 Tap  >  > **Display** > **Lock screen** > **Select screen lock**.
- 2 Select a desired screen lock from **None**, **Swipe**, **Knock Code**, **Pattern**, **PIN** and **Password**.



### NOTE

- Create a Google account before setting an unlock pattern and remember the Backup PIN you created when creating your pattern lock.

## Smart Lock

You can use Smart Lock to make unlocking your device easier. You can set it to keep your device unlocked when you have a trusted Bluetooth device connected to it, when it's in a familiar location like your home or work, when it recognizes your face or voice, or when it detects you're carrying it.

### Setting up the Smart Lock feature

- 1 Tap  >  > **Display** > **Lock screen** > **Smart Lock**.
- 2 Enter your unlock code and select the item you want to add to Smart Lock.
- 3 Follow the instructions on the screen.

#### **NOTE**

- Before you activate Smart Lock, you need to set up a screen lock (Knock Code, Pattern, PIN or Password).

# Your Home screen

## Touch screen tips

Here are some tips on how to navigate on your device.


- **Tap or touch** – A single finger tap selects items, links, shortcuts and letters on the on-screen keyboard.
- **Touch and hold** – Touch and hold an item on the screen by tapping it and not lifting your finger until an action occurs.
- **Drag** – Touch and hold an item for a moment and then, without lifting your finger, move your finger on the screen until you reach the target position. You can drag items on the Home screen to reposition them.
- **Swipe or slide** – To swipe or slide, quickly move your finger across the surface of the screen, without pausing when you first tap it (so you don't drag an item instead).
- **Double-tap** – Double-tap to zoom on a webpage or a map.
- **Pinch-to-Zoom** – Use your index finger and thumb in a pinching or spreading motion to zoom in or out when using the browser, Maps, or when viewing pictures.
- **Rotate the screen** – From many applications and menus, the screen orientation adjusts to the device's physical orientation.

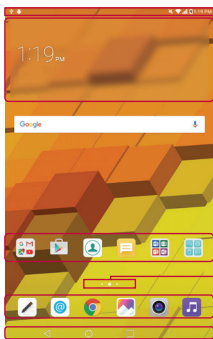


### NOTE

- Do not press too hard; the tap screen is sensitive enough to pick up a light, yet firm tap.
- Use the tip of your finger to tap the option you want. Be careful not to tap any other buttons.

# Home screen

The Home screen is the starting point for many applications and functions. It allows you to add items like apps and Google widgets to give you instant access to information and applications. This is the default canvas and accessible from any menu by tapping .



**1 Status Bar**

**2 Widget**

**3 Application Icons**

**4 Location Indicator**

**5 Quick Button Area**

**6 Home Touch Buttons**

- 1** Shows the device's status information, including the time, signal strength, battery status and notification icons.
- 2** Widgets are self-contained applications that can be accessed on the Home screen. Unlike a shortcut, a Widget can function as an on-screen application.
- 3** Tap an icon (application, folder, etc.) to open and use it.
- 4** Indicates which Home screen canvas you are currently viewing.
- 5** Provides one-touch access to the function from any Home screen canvas.

<b>6</b> ◀ <b>Back Button</b>	Returns to the previous screen. Also closes pop-up items, such as menus, dialog boxes and the on-screen keyboard.
○ <b>Home Button</b>	Return to the Home screen from any screen. Touch and hold to access the Google Now shortcut.
□ <b>Overview Button</b>	Displays recently used applications.


## Customizing the Home screen

You can customize your Home screen by adding apps and widgets and changing wallpapers.

### Adding a widget on your Home screen

- 1 Touch and hold the empty part of the Home screen.
- 2 Tap the **Widgets** and select the widget you want to add. You then see this added the widget on the Home screen.
- 3 Drag it to the desired location and lift your finger.

### Removing a widget from the Home screen

- While on the Home screen, touch and hold a widget you want to remove then drag it to  and release it.



### Adding an app to the Quick Button area

- While on the Home screen, touch and hold an app icon and drag it to the Quick Button area. Then release it in the desired location.

### Removing an app from the Quick Button area

- While on the Home screen, touch and hold an app icon and drag it out of the Quick Button area. Then release it in the desired location.


## Returning to recently-used applications

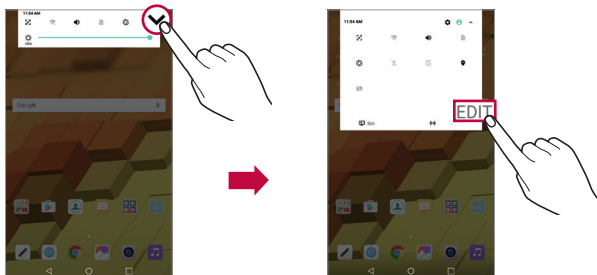
- 1 Tap . App previews of recently used applications will be displayed.
- 2 Tap an app preview to open the application. Or tap  to return to your previous screen.



## Notifications panel

You can open the notifications panel by dragging the status bar downward on the main screen.

- To open the quick access icons list, drag the notifications panel downwards or tap .
- To rearrange, add, or remove icons, tap **EDIT**.
- If you touch and hold the icon, the settings screen for the corresponding function appears.



## Indicator icons on the Status Bar

Indicator icons appear on the Status bar at the top of the screen to calendar events, device status and more.



The icons displayed at the top of the screen provide information about the status of the device. The icons listed in the table below are some of the most common ones.




### NOTE

- The icon's location in the Status bar may differ depending on the function or service.

## On-screen keyboard

You can enter text using the on-screen keyboard. The on-screen keyboard appears on the screen when you tap an available text entry field.

### Using the keypad and entering text

Icon	Description
	Tap once to capitalize the next letter you type. Double-tap for all caps.
	Tap to go to the keyboard settings. Touch and hold to enter text by voice, handwriting, or access the clip tray.
	Tap to enter a space.
	Tap to create a new line.
	Tap to delete the previous character.

### Entering special characters

The on-screen keyboard allows you to enter special characters.

For example, to input "á", touch and hold the "a" button until the pop-up appears and displays related special characters. Without lifting the finger, drag your finger to the desired special character. Once it's highlighted, lift your finger.

#### NOTE




- A symbol at the top right corner of a key indicates that additional characters are available for that key.

# Connecting to Networks and Devices

## Wi-Fi

You can use high-speed Internet access while within the coverage of the wireless access point (AP).

### Connecting to Wi-Fi networks

- 1 Tap  >  > **Wi-Fi**.
- 2 Tap  to turn Wi-Fi on and start scanning for available Wi-Fi networks.
- 3 Tap a network to connect to it.
  - If the network is secured with a lock icon, you will need to enter a security key or password.
- 4 The Status bar displays icons that indicate Wi-Fi status.

#### **NOTE**

- If you are out of the Wi-Fi zone or have set Wi-Fi to Off, the device may automatically connect to the Web using mobile data, which may incur data charges.

#### **TIP! How to obtain the MAC address**

- Tap  >  > **Wi-Fi** >  > **Advanced Wi-Fi** > **MAC address**.




## Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, computers, printers, and wireless devices.

### NOTE

- LG is not responsible for the loss, interception or misuse of data sent or received via the Bluetooth feature.
- Always make sure that you share and receive data with devices that are trusted and properly secured.
- If there are obstacles between the devices, the operating distance may be reduced.
- Some devices, especially those that are not tested or approved by Bluetooth SIG, may be incompatible with your device.

## Pairing your device with another Bluetooth device

- 1 Tap  >  > **Bluetooth**.
- 2 Tap  to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3 Tap **SEARCH** to view the visible devices in range.
- 4 Choose the device you want to pair with from the list. Once the pairing is successful, your device connects to the other device.

### NOTE

- Pairing between two Bluetooth devices is a one-time process. Once a pairing has been created, the devices will continue to recognize their partnership and exchange information.




### TIP!

- Please consult documentation included with Bluetooth device for information on pairing mode and passcode (typically 0 0 0 0 – four zeroes).

## Sending data via Bluetooth

- 1 Select a file or item, such as a contact or media file.
- 2 Select the option for sending data via Bluetooth.
- 3 Search for and pair with a Bluetooth-enabled device.
  - Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth compatible devices.

## Receiving data via Bluetooth

- 1 Tap  >  > **Bluetooth**.
- 2 Tap  to turn Bluetooth on.
- 3 You will receive a request to accept data from the sending device. Be sure to select **ACCEPT**.

## Wi-Fi Direct

Wi-Fi Direct provides a direct connection between Wi-Fi enabled devices without requiring an access point.

### Turning on Wi-Fi Direct

- 1 Tap  >  > **Wi-Fi**.
- 2 Tap  > **Advanced Wi-Fi** > **Wi-Fi Direct**.


#### **NOTE**

- When in this menu, your device is visible to other visible Wi-Fi Direct devices nearby.

# Content sharing

## Playing content from another device

You can play photos, videos or songs saved on your device from a TV.

- 1 Connect the TV and your device to the same Wi-Fi network.
- 2 While viewing the items from the **Gallery** or **Music** app, tap  > **Play on other device**.
- 3 Select the TV you want to connect to.

### NOTE

- For use with Chromecast, Google Play services should be up to date.

## Viewing content from nearby devices

You can view content from various devices, such as a computer, NAS or mobile device, by using the **Gallery** or **Music** apps.

### Connecting the devices

Connect both your device and another device that support DLNA function to the same wireless network.

### NOTE

- Make sure that File sharing (DLNA) is activated on both the device and the connected device.

## Searching for nearby devices



You can view a list of DLNA devices on the same network by selecting the **Nearby devices** tab in each app.

Use content from nearby devices as if you were using it on your device.

## Sending or receiving files



You can share files between your device and another LG device, or a tablet or computer.

### Sending files

From the **Gallery**, **File Manager** or **Music** app, tap  > **Share** or , then select a method on the file sharing list.

## Receiving files

Drag the status bar downward and tap , then tap **File sharing**.


If your device does not support the file sharing feature, tap  > **Settings** > **Share & connect** > **File sharing** > **SmartShare Beam** .

### NOTE

- Make sure that your device is connected to the same wireless network as the file transfer target device.
- Make sure that File sharing is activated on both the device and the target device.

## Sending files to a computer

You can quickly send large files to your computer.

- 1 Install LG Bridge on your computer.
- 2 Start LG Bridge on the computer, then sign in using your LG account.
- 3 Tap  > **Settings** > **Share & connect** > **LG AirDrive**, then sign in using your LG account.

### NOTE

- You can download LG Bridge from the LG Mobile website ([www.lg.com](http://www.lg.com)).



## QPair

By connecting your tablet and mobile device via QPair, you can sync incoming calls, messages, and social networking notifications between your tablet and mobile device.



1 Run **QPair**  and tap **GET STARTED > Start** on your tablet first and then run the same steps on your device.

### **TIP!**

- QPair may not be pre-installed on the device. Go to the Google Play Store and search for QPair and install it.

### **NOTE**

- QPair works with devices running Android 4.1 or later. Some features may be limited depending on your device model.
- Since QPair uses the Bluetooth function, it may not work normally if you change the Bluetooth settings while QPair is in use.

2 Bluetooth connection will be turned on and you will be able to pair the devices.

## QPair features

**Call notifications** – Sends the tablet a notification when the device receives a call. The notification displays the caller's number and allows you to answer and decline the call. You can also change call settings, such as a ringtone, ringtone volume, ringtone with vibration, or send a decline message when you get a call.

### NOTE

- You can only receive a call supported by Bluetooth technology. Dialing a call from the tablet using the QPair feature is not possible.

**Message notifications** – Sends the tablet a notification when the device receives a message. You can also change message settings, such as message pop-up, message preview, notification sound, and notification vibration.

**Social network notifications** – Displays a social networking notification on your tablet's Status Bar when it arrives on your device.

### NOTE

- To enable this feature, turn the **QPair social network notifications** option on your device. This option allows you to be notified of social networking notifications on your tablet.

**Capture+ transfer** – Saves your current Capture+ in the tablet's Gallery, and then syncs the tablet's Gallery with the Gallery on your device.

## Transferring data between a PC and your device

You can copy or move data between a PC and the device.

### Transferring data

- 1 Connect your device to a PC using the USB cable that came with your device.
- 2 Open the Notifications panel, tap the current USB connection, and select **File transfer**.
- 3 A window will pop-up on your PC, allowing you to transfer the desired data.

#### NOTE

- The LG United Mobile Driver is required to be installed on your PC to be able to detect the device.
- Check the requirements for using **File transfer**.

You can add contacts on your device and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google Account or other accounts that support syncing contacts.

## Searching for a contact

- 1 Tap  > .
- 2 Tap **Search contacts** and enter the contact name using the keyboard.



## Adding a new contact

- 1 Tap  >  > .
- 2 Select the desired account (if applicable).
- 3 If you want to add a picture to the new contact, tap . Choose **Take photo** or **Select photo**.
- 4 Enter the desired information for the contact.
- 5 Tap **SAVE**.



## Favourites contacts

You can classify frequently called contacts as favourites.




### Adding a contact to your favourites

- 1 Tap  > .
- 2 Tap a contact to view its details.
- 3 Tap the star at the top right of the contact details screen. The star will be highlighted.

### Removing a contact from your favourites list

- 1 Tap  > .
- 2 Choose a contact from the **FAVOURITES** list.
- 3 Tap the highlighted star at the top right of the contact details screen. The highlight will be removed from the star and the contact is removed from your **FAVOURITES**.

## Creating a group




- 1 Tap  > .
- 2 Tap **Groups** > .
- 3 Enter a name for the new group.
- 4 Tap **Add members** to add contacts to the group.
- 5 Tap **SAVE** to save the group.

### **NOTE**

- If you delete a group, the contacts assigned to that group will not be lost. They will remain in your contact list.

## Merging and Separating Contacts

When you have two or more entries for the same contact, you can merge them into a single entry. You can also separate contacts that were merged.

- 1 Tap  > .
- 2 Tap  > **More** > **Manage contacts** > **Merge**.
- 3 Select a tab at the top of the screen.
  - Tap **Merge suggestion** to select entries you want to merge.
  - Tap **Merged contacts** to select entries you want to separate.
- 4 Checkmark the entry (or entries) you want to merge or separate, then tap the **Merge** or **Separate** button.

# Messaging

Your device combines text and multimedia messaging into one intuitive, easy to use menu.

## NOTE

- You may be charged for each message you send. Please consult with your service provider.

## Sending a message


1 Tap  >  > .


2 Tap , then select one or more entries from your Contacts list.

### OR

Enter a contact name or contact number into the **To** field. As you enter the contact name, matching contacts appear. You can tap a suggested recipient and add more than one contact.

3 Tap the text field and start entering your message.

4 Tap  to open the options menu. Choose from any of the available options.

5 Tap  to attach the file that you want to share with message.

6 Tap **Send** to send your message.

## Conversation view

Messages exchanged with another party are displayed in chronological order so that you can conveniently see and find your conversations.

## Changing your messaging settings

Your device's messaging settings are predefined to allow you to send messages immediately. You can change the settings based on your preferences.

- Tap  >  >  > **Settings**.

# E-mail

You can use the Email application to read email from providers other than Gmail. The Email application supports the following account types: POP3, IMAP and Microsoft Exchange (for Enterprise users).





## Managing email accounts

### To open the Email application

The first time you open the Email application, a setup wizard opens to help you add an email account. You can also add your email account using the **Settings** menu.

- Tap  > .





### Adding another email account:

- Tap  >  >  > **Settings** > .

### Changing the email general settings:

- Tap  >  >  > **Settings**.

### Deleting an email account:




- Tap  >  >  > **Settings** >  > **Remove account** > Select the account to delete (if necessary) > **REMOVE** (if necessary) > **REMOVE**.

## Working with account folders

Each account has Inbox, VIP, Sent, and Drafts. Depending on the features supported by your account's service provider, you may have additional folders.



## Composing and sending email

- 1 In the **Email** application, tap  to create a new email.
- 2 Enter an address for the message's intended recipient. As you enter text, matching addresses will be offered from your contacts. Separate multiple addresses with semicolons.
- 3 Tap the **Cc/Bcc** field to copy or blind copy to other contacts/email addresses.
- 4 Tap the text field and enter your message.
- 5 Tap  to attach the file you want to send with your message.
- 6 Tap  to send the message.

# Camera and Video

## Camera options on the viewfinder

You can use the camera or camcorder to take and share pictures and videos.

- Tap  > .


### NOTE













- Be sure to clean the protective lens cover with a microfiber cloth before taking pictures. A lens cover with smudges from fingers can cause blurry pictures with a "halo" effect.




- 1 Hide/Display Options** – Tap to hide/display the camera options on the viewfinder.
- 2 Swap camera** – Tap to swap between the rear camera lens and the front camera lens.
- 3 Settings** – Tap this icon to open the camera settings menu.
- 4 Gallery** – Tap to view the last photo or video you captured.
- 5 Record** – Tap to start recording.
- 6 Capture** – Tap to take a photo.
- 7 Exit** – Tap to exit the camera.

## Using the advanced settings

In the camera viewfinder, tap  to show the advanced options. Tap each icon to adjust the following camera settings.







	Set the size of your picture and video.

# LG Backup

You can back up and restore data saved on your device. Regularly save backup files to a computer or an external storage. This allows you to restore data when your device is stolen or data is accidentally deleted or transformed.

## WIRELESS NETWORKS

### Wi-Fi

Turns on Wi-Fi to connect to available Wi-Fi networks.

### Bluetooth

Turns the Bluetooth wireless feature on or off to use Bluetooth.

### Mobile data

Displays the data usage and allows you to set a personalized mobile data usage limit.

### Share & connect

- **File sharing** – You can send and receive files between your device and other LG devices or tablets.
  - **LG G Pad™ III 8.0** – Set your device's name.
  - **Save to** – Set the destination folder to save files sent from other devices.
  - **File sharing** – Permit receipt of files sent from other devices.
  - **SmartShare Beam** – Share files with other devices via SmartShare Beam.
  - **Help** – Displays help information about using the file sharing feature.
- **Media server** – You can share media content on your device with nearby devices that support DLNA.
  - **Content sharing** – Share content on your device with nearby devices.
  - **LG G Pad™ III 8.0** – Set your device's name.



- **Content to share** – Select the type of media content to share with other devices.
- **Allowed devices** – View a list of devices permitted to access content on your device.
- **Not-allowed devices** – View a list of devices not permitted to access content on your device.
- **Screen sharing** – You can mirror your tablet screen and sound onto Miracast dongle or TV wirelessly.
- **LG AirDrive** – Allows you to connect to your PC to manage your tablet. Download LG Bridge from the LG Electronics website on your PC before use. When you sign in to the same LG Account on your tablet and PC, you can use the LG AirDrive function.
- **Printing** – Allows you to print the content of certain screens (such as web pages displayed in Chrome) to a printer connected to the same Wi-Fi network as your Android device.

## Tethering

- **USB tethering** – Allows you to share the internet connection with your computer via a USB cable.

- **Help** – Displays Help information about USB tethering, Wi-Fi hotspot, and Bluetooth tethering.

## More

- **Airplane mode** – Airplane Mode (flight mode) allows you to use many of your device's features, such as games, and music, when you are in an area where data use is prohibited. When you set your device to Airplane Mode, it cannot access online data.
- **Mobile networks** – Set options for network operators, access point names, and mobile data.

- **VPN** – From your device, you can add, set up, and manage virtual private networks (VPNs) that allow you to connect and access resources inside a secured local network, such as your corporate network.

## DEVICE

### Sound

#### **Sound profile**

Allows you to set the sound profile to **Sound, Vibrate only** and **Silent**.

#### **Volume**

Adjust the device's volume settings to suit your needs and environment.

Set the time, range and app type to receive notification messages. Receive notification messages only on particular days of the week.

Select the apps that can show their notification messages on the screen, and set the priorities of those apps in regard to notification messages.

## Font size

Select the desired font size.

## Bold text

Bold the text on the screen.

## Brightness

Allows you to adjust the screen brightness.

## Night brightness

Set brightness at 0% automatically between 12:00 AM ~ 06:00 AM.

## Comfort view

Reduce the amount of blue light on the screen to reduce eye strain.

## Auto-rotate screen

Allows you to set to switch the screen orientation automatically when you physically rotate the device.

## Screen timeout

Allows you to set the amount of time before the screen times out.

## Home touch buttons

Allows you to set which Home touch buttons are displayed and their position on the bar. You can also select the color.

## Display size

Zoom in or out the screen.

## Improve video quality

Improve the video quality for low-quality videos. HQV is a product of Qualcomm Technologies, Inc.

## Screen saver

Display a screen saver when the device is connected to the holder or charger. Select a screen saver type to display.

## Motion sensor calibration

Allows you to improve the accuracy of the tilt and speed of the sensor.

## Smart cleaning


Displays the space in use and free space in your tablet and allows you to selectively clean up your files.

## Storage

### DEVICE STORAGE

View the total storage space and free space in the device's internal storage. View a list of apps in use and the storage capacity for each app.

### PORTABLE STORAGE

View the total storage space and free space in the memory card. This option appears only when a memory card is inserted. To unmount the memory card, tap .

## Battery & power saving

### BATTERY INFORMATION

The Battery charge information is displayed on a battery graphic along with the percentage of the remaining charge and its status.


#### Battery usage

Displays the battery usage level and battery use details. Tap one of the items to see more detailed information.

#### Battery percentage on status bar

Turn on to display the battery level percentage on the Status bar next to the battery icon.

#### Battery saver

Tap the Battery Saver switch  to toggle it On or Off. You can also set when to turn battery saver on.

## Memory

You can monitor the memory used on average and the memory used by apps in the device.

## Apps

Display the list of applications such as currently running or downloaded. Tap an entry to view more information, tap **Force stop**, then **OK** to stop it from running.

## Cloud

Allows you to add a cloud account to quickly and easily use a cloud service.

## Users

This menu displays the current users you've created.

### **ADD USER**

Allows you to add new account for the device and use the Multi-user feature.

## Location

Turn on location service, your device determines your approximate location using Wi-Fi and mobile networks. When you select this option, you're asked whether you consent to allowing Google to use your location when providing these services.

- **Mode** – Sets the how your current location information is determined.
- **RECENT LOCATION REQUEST** – Displays applications and services that have recently requested your location .
- **Camera** – Checkmark to tag photos or videos with their locations.
- **Google Location History** – Allows you to view and manage your Google location history.

## Security

Use the Security menu to configure how to help secure your device and its data.

### **Content lock**

Allows you to lock files for the Gallery and memos for QuickMemo+. Choose from Password or Pattern.

### **Encrypt SD card**

Encrypt SD card storage and keep data unavailable for other devices.

## **Secure start-up**

When you power on your tablet, you will be required to enter your screen lock.

## **Set up SIM card lock**

Sets the PIN to lock your SIM card and allows you to change the PIN.

## **Password typing visible**

Set to briefly show each character of passwords as you enter them so that you can see what you enter.

## **Tablet administrators**

View or deactivate device administrators.

## **Unknown sources**

Allow installation of non-Play Store applications.

## **Credential protection**

View the storage type where the security certificate will be saved.

## **Certificate management**

Allows you to manage your security certificates.

## **Trust agents**

Select apps to use without unlocking the screen.

## **Screen pin**

This feature allows you to lock your device so that the current user can only access the pinned app. This is useful for users with children.

## **Usage access**

Allow this app to view usage info of apps on your device.



## Accounts & sync

Use the Accounts & sync settings menu to add, remove, and manage your Google and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and sync data on their own schedules and whether all applications can synchronize user data automatically.

Gmail™, Calendar, and other applications may also have their own settings to control how they synchronize data; see the sections on those applications for details. Touch **ADD ACCOUNT** to add new account.

## Language & keyboard

Use the Language & keyboard settings to select the language for the text on your device and to configure the on-screen keyboard, including words you've added to its dictionary.

## Backup & reset

Change the settings for managing your settings and data.

### **LG Backup**

Backs up all information on the device and restores it in the event of data loss or replacement. If you need more information, please refer to the **LG Backup** section in **Apps**.

### **Back up my data**

Back up app data, Wi-Fi passwords, and other settings to Google servers.

### **Backup account**

Displays the account that is currently being used to back up information.

### **Automatic restore**

When reinstalling an app, restore backed up settings and data.

### **Network settings reset**

Reset all network settings.

### **Factory data reset**

Reset your settings to the factory default values and delete all your data. If you reset the device this way, you are prompted to re-enter the same information as when you first started Android.

Use this menu to manage your Google apps and account settings.

### QuickButton

Select the app you wish to get quick access to using QuickButton.

### Shortcut keys

Get quick access to apps by pressing the **Volume Keys** twice when the screen is off or locked.

- Press the **Volume Up Key** twice to open the Capture+ app.
- Press the **Volume Down Key** twice to launch the Camera app.

### Date & time

Use Date & time settings to set how dates will be displayed. You can also use these settings to set your own time and time zone rather than obtaining the current time from the mobile network.

### Accessibility

Use the Accessibility settings to configure accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your device.

- **Vision** – Sets options for people with impaired sight.
  - **TalkBack** – Allows you to set up the TalkBack function which assists people with impaired vision by providing verbal feedback.
  - **Font size** – Sets the font size.
  - **Bold text** – Bold the text on the screen.
  - **Display size** – Zoom in or out the screen.
  - **Touch zoom** – Allows you to zoom in and out by triple-tapping the screen.
  - **Window zoom** – Magnify or reverse a part of the screen.

  - **Physical keyboard** – Customize the keyboard settings.
  - **Auto mouse click** – Automatically click where the pointer stops.
  - **Screen timeout** – Sets the amount of time before the backlight turns off automatically.
  - **Touch control areas** – Allows you to select an area of the screen to limit touch activation to just that area of the screen.
- **Accessibility features shortcut** – Allow you to access selected features quickly when triple-tapping the Home button.
- **Auto-rotate screen** – Enable to allow the device to rotate the screen depending on the physical device orientation (portrait or landscape).

Please note that removing the USB cable or battery during the upgrade may seriously damage your device.

## LG Device Software Update via Over-the-Air (OTA)

This feature allows you to update the firmware of your device to the newer version conveniently via OTA without connecting the USB cable. This feature is only available if and when LG makes the newer version of the firmware available for your device.

First, you can check the software version on your device:

Tap  >  > **About tablet** > **Software info**.

To perform the device software update, tap  >  > **About tablet** > **Update Center** > **Software Update** > **Check now for update**.

### NOTE

- Your personal data—including information about your Google account and any other accounts, your system/application data and settings, any downloaded applications and your DRM licence —might be lost in the process of updating your device's software. Therefore, LG recommends that you back up your personal data before updating your device's software. LG does not take responsibility for any loss of personal data.

# Anti-Theft Guide

Set up your device to prevent other people from using it if it's been reset to factory settings without your permission. For example, if your device is lost, stolen, or wiped, only someone with your Google account or screen lock information can use the device.

All you need to make sure your device is protected is:

- **Set a screen lock:** If your device is lost or stolen but you have a screen lock set, the device can't be erased using the Settings menu unless your screen is unlocked.
